10% of CO employment

Colorado's tech industry employs over 302,489 workers at 32,703 tech establishments, paying almost \$45 billion in earnings to workers in the state. (2023)



Colorado has the 3rd most concentrated tech industry economy, behind Massachusetts and New Mexico. (2023)

3.67 jobs

For every 1 new tech industry job, another 2.67 jobs were added elsewhere — one of the largest job multipliers across Colorado. This multiplier effect increased from a value of 3.42 in 2021. (2023)



Colorado's tech industry contributes over \$106 billion in gross state product (GSP), which is 20% of the state's total economic output — a 2% rise from 2021. (2023)



Colorado's tech industry has added 47,440 net jobs, the most added by any major industry in the state. (2018–23)



with about 2,500 employers competing for AI specific talent. (Nov 2023–24) **418.6**%

IT industry growth

Colorado IT industry employment grew by 18.6% from 2018–23, the 10th fastest rate in the nation. In the next five years, CO IT industry employment is expected to grow by an additional 11.5%, the 5th highest predicted growth rate. (2018–23)



The average earnings per worker in Colorado's tech industry is \$165,500. (2023)

highest rate of SBIR/STTR funding

From 2018–23, when the level of Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) and Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) funding is standardized by the size of the state economy, Colorado has the 3rd highest rate of funding — an improvement from a previous ranking of 5th from 2016–21. (2018–23)



venture capital funding

Colorado ranked 5th in the US in venture capital funding rates from 2018–23.


